# Well Mannered Puppy Certificate in Pet Dog Obedience

A good focus and attention on their owner when requested with an excellent positive response to the use of their name.

Wearing ID disc, suitable collar, lead, and microchip papers available for inspection. Owners should also be carrying a poo bag and arrive at training on time. A good response to sit without visible treats in the hand

A good response to down (treat can be used in the hand)

An 8-week socialization diary needs to be completed and handed in before assessment.

Good Manners towards owners – no jumping up and no mouthing.

Pup should be able to walk with a well-trained dog alongside them without jumping at the other dog.

Pups should be able to perform a simple meet and greet with another pup and owner with the pup remaining focused on the owner. Treats can be used.

Pup beginning to establish a stay on their mat/raised dog bed.

Pups should be able to perform a “stop cue” and recall to owner.

Pups should have basic play recall with no distraction.

Pups should be able to have their collar, lead and harness on without worry and without any reaction when lead goes on and off.

Pups should be able to walk a simple straight line, staying with the owners and not dragging on their lead.

Demonstrating a willingness to learn and be with their owner.

A good attitude to training

Starting to show restraint when offered toys for play etc.

Not mouthing/biting when groomed/inspected

Take food gently on a cue if needed

Owner should know when to take their pup to the vet
